# UNIT 1

- See the list of additional materials needed on TG pg. 4. It is important to gather these materials in advance.
- Lessons 1-6, 11-20, and 25-29: Require advance preparation.
- All lessons in this unit (except the assessment lessons) require advance preparation. This preparation should only take 5-10 minutes or so in most cases and it is recommended you do it the night before. If you have time, please read through the upcoming day's lesson the night before.
- Starting in Lesson 19, many lessons during this school year will suggest using the media disk or big book. While the big book is included in the files you downloaded, it is a resource meant to demonstrate fluent reading within a classroom setting. The stories in the big book are identical to the stories in the student reader and as a homeschooler, you can simply use the student reader alongside your student.
- Lesson 2: The Consonants Code Flip Book, Vowel Code Flip Book, and Spelling Cards are located in the Grade 1 Ancillary Components folder you downloaded from the CK website.

- Lesson 5: Large Letter Cards are located in the Grade 1 Ancillary Components folder you downloaded from the CK website.
- Lessons 21 and 22: Suggest using a handheld mirror during an activity (optional).
- Wiggle cards are introduced in the Unit 1 Pausing Point (see TG pg. 226 for an explanation). Wiggle cards will also be used in future units so please set them aside in a safe place.
- As your student nears the end of Unit 1, please take some time to look at the Pausing Point activity suggestions (pg. 213) to choose a few activities to reinforce what your student has learned. Some activities require additional supplies and/or advance preparation.
- It is highly recommended that you set aside some time to read carefully through the Appendix (TG pg. 241) to better understand the CKLA approach to phonics.

- Pausing Point: As your student nears the end of Unit 2, please take some time to look at the Pausing Point activity suggestions (pg. 109) to choose a few activities to reinforce what your student has learned. Some activities require additional supplies and/or advance preparation.

- Lesson 11: Requires a timer. Most smartphones have a timer app as part of the phone's pre-installed apps.
- Pausing Point: As your student nears the end of Unit 3, please take some time to look at the Pausing Point activity suggestions (pg. 132) to choose a few activities to reinforce what your student has learned. Some activities require additional supplies and/or advance preparation.
